- If you were writing a psalm, what image would you use to picture man's transience? What was the cause of man's transience, and why does that bring grief?
- What does it mean to 'number our days', and how does numbering our days lead to 'a heart of wisdom'?
- Where do we find real satisfaction that will truly last? Why do you think we don't experience that as often as we'd like? How do we experience that satisfaction more often?




