Confessing the Faith

Heidelberg Catechism Questions 1, 2, 86

Mr. Steve Lanier

Q1. What is your only comfort in life and in death?

A. That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ.

He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; in fact, all things must work together for my salvation. Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me whole-heartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.

Q2. What must you know to live and die in the joy of this comfort?

A. Three things: first, how great my sin and misery are; second, how I am set free from all my sins and misery; third, how I am to thank God for such deliverance.

Q86. Since we have been delivered from our misery by grace through Christ without any merit of our own, why then should we do good works?

A. Because Christ, having redeemed us by his blood, is also restoring us by his Spirit into his image, so that with our whole lives we may show that we are thankful to God for his benefits, so that he may be praised through us, so that we may be assured of our faith by its fruits, and so that by our godly living our neighbors may be won over to Christ.

 this collection a response to Psalm 89 in a season of postexilic disappointment
 when it seems like the promises of God have failed?
- What does the practice of gratitude look like in your life? In seasons of your life where you have practiced gratitude well, how has it shaped your life?
 When do you find yourself the most ungrateful? Discuss a time when you found yourself 'giving thanks' despite your circumstances.
- Discuss whether you think commitment to service has increased or declined in our culture in the last 10 years. What factors contributed to that change?
- How has your commitment to service changed in the last 10 years? What shaped that change?
- 'Know' is a deeply intimate word. Which ideas does it introduce (vv.3,5), and
 why do you think the Psalmist invites us to meditate on these truths? How do
 you think an intimate 'knowing' of these truths shapes our service and our gratitude?
