Old Testament Scripture Reading

Jeremiah 29:1-11

These are the words of the letter that Jeremiah the prophet sent from Jerusalem to the surviving elders of the exiles, and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people, whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon. This was after King Jeconiah and the queen mother, the eunuchs, the officials of Judah and Jerusalem, the craftsmen, and the metal workers had departed from Jerusalem. The letter was sent by the hand of Elasah the son of Shaphan and Gemariah the son of Hilkiah, whom Zedekiah king of Judah sent to Babylon to Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon. It said: "Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat their produce. Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare. For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Do not let your prophets and your diviners who are among you deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams that they dream, for it is a lie that they are prophesying to you in my name; I did not send them, declares the Lord. "For thus says the Lord: When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will visit you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place. For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.

SERMON NOTES

Pastor Elbert McGowan, Jr.—April 14, 2024
"The Blessing of God: A Journey of Faithfulness, Patience and Faith"
—Genesis 30:25-43

SERMON QUESTIONS

- What stood out/challenged you most about the sermon?
- · What encouraged you the most about the sermon?
- Put yourself in Jacob's shoes. Have you ever endured a season when it appeared that God's blessing galloped toward others while moving at the pace of a slow crawl toward you? What did that feel like?
- To add insult to injury, what kind of man is Laban? What happened to his estate during Jacob's 14 years of service? On the other hand, what happened to Jacob? Yet, God doesn't release Jacob until 31:3, though he wanted to in 30:25. Why is this hard to stomach?
- Where else in scripture do we see God calling believers to be a blessing to others, particularly his/our enemies? How did Jacob bless Laban? We made the distinction between "blessing" and "Blessing." Why is this hard?
- Can you recall other passages in scripture where God's people struggled with being a blessing to others? We are often guilty of being impatient, indifferent, or ingratiating ourselves into the behaviors of the world. How has Jacob proved this? When have you responded like this? Might this move us to repentance?
- God did not only tell Abraham that he would be a blessing to others. He also told him that He would bless him and curse those who dishonor him (see Gen.12:1-4). That same promise is true for Isaac and Jacob. Does this help us make sense of what's happening in 30:37-43?
- Are you surprised by Jacob's "cutting sticks and placing them in front of the flock" ordeal? 31:10-13 sheds light on it. God appeared to Jacob in a dream and told him what He was about to do. God is causing Jacob to prosper, even through the means of sticks Jacob cut.
- God has used something even more astonishing than "cut sticks" to bless his people. He has used His sent son and a wooden cross to lavish us with all blessings and as a perpetual reminder that He will always supply our spiritual and physical needs. What would it look like to believe this? How might this transform us?

The Psalms are full of raw honesty, overwhelming grief, and incomprehensible joy—all tools for the loving father to woo us into his presence. He says, "Bring your whole self. I want all of you."

Brokenness and heartache, doubt and confidence, and anger and exaltation are all welcome in God's presence. And as we walk the well-worn words of saints who have gone before, the path will emerge to bring our whole selves before the face of God. And that's where intimacy begins.
