New Testament Scripture Reading 1 Corinthians 10:1-13 Mr. Jermaine Van Buren, Jr.

For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, and all ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ. Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness. Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did. Do not be idolaters as some of them were; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play." —Numbers 20:2-13

SERMON QUESTIONS

- In our passage, Moses and the Israelites have been wandering in the wilderness for over 40 years. Describe a time when you felt weary, worn-down or exhausted.
- God led his people into the wilderness for their good, to teach them to trust him. How might God be using this season of your life to teach you to trust Him?
- According to the passage, God showed Himself holy through Israel's complaining and Moses' unbelief. God's holiness standard is perfection, and all fall short of his glory. Take some time this week to meditate on the holiness of God and ask his Spirit to expose sin in your life and to lead you to repentance by his kindness.
- Moses failed to trust God in our passage, yet God graciously brought him to the Promised Land so that he could see it for himself. God is holy and gracious! Think about a time where God has shown you his grace in response to your own sin and failure.

There are times when intimacy with God feels like chasing the wind. Intimacy is found at the intersection of longing and belonging, transparency and acceptance, abiding and beholding. In the Psalms, God takes the words of his saints and they become the word of God as a path to bring our whole self before him. The Psalms are full of raw honesty, overwhelming grief, and incomprehensible joy—all tools for the loving father to woo us into his presence. He says, "Bring your whole self. I want all of you."

Brokenness and heartache, doubt and confidence, and anger and exaltation are all welcome in God's presence. And as we walk the well-worn words of saints who have gone before, the path will emerge to bring our whole selves before the face of God. And that's where intimacy begins.

Befriend: Creating Belonging in a Lonely & Isolated World: Fellowship Hall

Sometimes we find in seasons of life that busyness and social media have left a void of deep, intentional friendship. What ever happened to connection and belonging? Where can I know others and be known?

Using Scott Sauls' book, *Befriend*, this class will make a case for building friendships that go beyond a digital, transactional, or one-dimensional nature and turn into relationships that are vulnerable, transparent, loving, and loyal. Sauls creates categories, each with a biblical foundation, for various types of friendship and gives us a different lens to see those we encounter day by day. He encourages us to befriend "the One in the Mirror," "the 'Other," "True Friends and Significant Others," "the Poor and Empty-Handed," "the Rich and Powerful," and so many more. The end result is a paradigm for friendship that challenges us to love others the way Jesus did.
