Heidelberg Catechism

Q 26: What do you believe when you say, "I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth"?

A: That the eternal Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who out of nothing created heaven and earth and everything in them, who still upholds and rules them by his eternal counsel and providence, is my God and Father because of Christ his Son. I trust him so much that I do not doubt he will provide whatever I need for body and soul, and he will turn to my good whatever adversity he sends me in this sad world. He is able to do this because he is almighty God; he desires to do this because he is a faithful Father.

Q 27: What do you understand by the providence of God?

A: God's providence is his almighty and ever present power, whereby, as with his hand, he still upholds heaven and earth and all creatures, and so governs them that leaf and blade, rain and drought, fruitful and barren years, food and drink, health and sickness, riches and poverty, indeed, all things, come to us not by chance but by his fatherly hand.

Q 28: What does it benefit us to know that God has created all things and still upholds them by his providence?

A: We can be patient in adversity, thankful in prosperity, and with a view to the future we can have a firm confidence in our faithful God and Father that no creature shall separate us from his love; for all creatures are so completely in his hand that without his will they cannot so much as move.

SERMON QUESTIONS

- What impacted you most from the sermon?
- What might the Holy Spirit be calling you to repent of? What might He be calling you to believe more deeply this morning?
- Can you recall a time in your life when loss paved the way for spiritual gain? While it is not the only way God helps us to cherish Him above all things, it is a way he does this. Where else, is the Bible, is this dynamic in play?
- Jacob wrestles with God. We could also say that God picked a
 fight with Jacob. Numerous lessons can be learned from that wrestling match! What do we learn about God? What do we learn
 about Jacob? What do we learn about us? How is the Gospel portrayed in this scene?
- Jacob, after the loss and the wrestling match, is a new man. The sun is now rising. He has a new name and a new walk. What truths are communicated in those things?
- What might it look like for you to walk in the newness of life with gospel humility, dependency and an even deeper love for Jesus?
- In Genesis 33, everything that was threatened is restored! Jacob and Esau are reunited. His family is safe, along with his possessions. How does this help us to grasp aspects of our future inheritance? In the end, because we are in Jesus, we will dwell with God and enjoy the beautiful restoration of all good things! Do you believe this?

There are times when intimacy with God feels like chasing the wind. Intimacy is found at the intersection of longing and belonging, transparency and acceptance, abiding and beholding. In the Psalms, God takes the words of his saints and they become the word of God as a path to bring our whole self before him. The Psalms are full of raw honesty, overwhelming grief, and incomprehensible joy—all tools for the loving father to woo us into his presence. He says, "Bring your whole self. I want all of you."

Brokenness and heartache, doubt and confidence, and anger and exaltation are all welcome in God's presence. And as we walk the well-worn words of saints who have gone before, the path will emerge to bring our whole selves before the face of God. And that's where intimacy begins.

Befriend: Creating Belonging in a Lonely & Isolated World: Fellowship Hall

Sometimes we find in seasons of life that busyness and social media have left a void of deep, intentional friendship. What ever happened to connection and belonging? Where can I know others and be known?

Using Scott Sauls' book, *Befriend*, this class will make a case for building friendships that go beyond a digital, transactional, or one-dimensional nature and turn into relationships that are vulnerable, transparent, loving, and loyal. Sauls creates categories, each with a biblical foundation, for various types of friendship and gives us a different lens to see those we encounter day by day. He encourages us to befriend "the One in the Mirror," "the 'Other," "True Friends and Significant Others," "the Poor and Empty-Handed," "the Rich and Powerful," and so many more. The end result is a paradigm for friendship that challenges us to love others the way Jesus did.
